MASHS conferences originated from the first conference given at the University of Brest in 2007, which was organized by professors belonging to different disciplines and fields (economics and management, geography, mathematics and computer science...). Following this first event, the conference was organized in Créteil (2008), Toulouse (2009), Lille (2010 ; post-proceedings published in [CSBIGS special issue](#)) and Marseille (2011 ; post-proceedings to be published). Next session will be organized at the University of Paris 1.

The purpose of this conference is to promote the ***use of mathematics and computer science to different fields -human and social sciences-*** (economy, geography, sociology, management without being exhaustive). Any researcher willing to present its work on another subject related to modeling applied to social and human science is kindly invited to propose a paper. The articles will be published in the journal [**RNTI \(Revue des Nouvelles Technologies de l'Information\)**](#) (web site: <http://www.antsearch.univ-tours.fr/rnti>).

How to submit an article ?

Two types of articles can be submitted, in French or in English:

- full length article for publication in RNTI (maximum 10 pages): LaTeX class file is available on RNTI web site;
- short article (maximum 4 pages; written with word, openoffice writer, or LaTeX). Word and LaTeX class files are available on the conference web site.

Articles should be easily accessible to any people attending the conference and thus technical presentation should be avoided. The deadline for submitting an article is:

April 13rd, 2012
